

## Faculty Scholarship

Applications are invited for up to three Scholarships being offered by the Faculty of Education to study for a PhD in the following areas of research:

- Creativity, Culture and Education
- Religion, Faith and Education
- Lifelong Learning
- Adult Education
- Education, Social Inclusion and Global Justice.
- Science Education, New Technologies and Learning.
- Pedagogy, Policy and Practice.
- Teacher Education.
- Leadership and Learning in the Professions]
- Higher Education Studies

The scholarship will provide an annual stipend of £12,600 per annum with fees paid at the Home/EU rate. Fees-only scholarships may be considered. The Scholarship will run for three years commencing on 22 September 2009.

## How to apply

Applications should be made using the University on-line application procedure and should clearly state that you are applying for the Faculty of Education Scholarship and which area of research you are applying for.

Please submit the following documents with your application:

Information about your previous study (copies of your degree certificates and transcripts of your undergraduate or previous degrees);

Two supporting reference letters;

Research proposal;

Applicants whose first language (or the language of instruction for their first degree) is not English are required to include evidence of their English Language ability, this should be a minimum IELTS score of 6.5;

Please also submit a one page document to Myrtle Porch <u>m.porch@educ.gla.ac.uk</u> explaining how your studies will contribute to the research being conducted in your chosen area.
