

# eucen Informs



## 25 years of history - a brief summary



eucen was born at a meeting of universities held in Bristol (UK) on 04-05 May 1991. More than 20 participants decided to explore prospects for international collaboration in university continuing education. During the meeting 10 different countries presented a description of the national picture of continuing education and the group set the objectives they felt Europe needed to achieve.

After some years of initial work under the directions of eucen's first president, Peter von Mitschke-Collande, who set the main ways of working (such as establishing the organisation of two conferences per year), the Association started its journey, nowadays fully consolidated, with the coordination of EU -funded projects such as TheNUCE during the mandate of president Victor de Kosinsky. TheNUCE allowed over 25 members of eucen to work together, exchange ideas and develop the basis for better continuing education in their own universities.

Consolidation of eucen as a relevant and influential Association in Europe started without doubt when the Steering Committee group led by eucen's third president, Manuel Assunção, decided to transform the voluntary-based Association into a professional one, employing a full time director, Pat Davies, and permanent full time support staff based in Barcelona that started developing projects such as

EQUIPE Plus<sup>1</sup>. The team brought eucen to another level, engaging in big contracts that allowed the office to grow as never before and engage in a wider range of activities.

This period was followed in 2006 with president Michel Feutrie's deep involvement with key policy makers in Brussels and visionary production of materials such as the outputs of BeFlex+<sup>2</sup>, ALLUME<sup>3</sup> or OBSERVAL<sup>4</sup>.

More recently in 2011, Andrea Waxenegger became the first female president of eucen with a clear internationalisation focus.

Since 2015, Françoise de Viron, our current president, has taken the lead.

#### Cultural Diversity: our next challenge

eucen has just started its new project HE4u2 - Integrating Cultural Diversity in Higher Education (KA3, support for policy reforms - forward looking cooperation project).

HE4u2 intends to reform teaching and learning in HE and make it more diverse, responsive and competitive by integrating inclusive pedagogy into existing curricula to

mediate obstacles for learners from migrant and culturally diverse backgrounds and to value their contribution to the intercultural dimension for all learners.

The approach will be used in up to 21 different disciplines at different HE levels. A guide for HE teachers and supporting staff will be developed and a Continuing Professional Development (CPD) course for HE staff will be designed.

## Contribution to the Modernisation Agenda for Higher Education in the European Union

## **New Publication "Universities and Engagement"**

The book "Universities and Engagement. International perspectives on higher education and lifelong learning" examines what HEI can contribute to society through LLL. Timely and insightful, this book, edited by John Field, Bernhard Schmidt-Hertha and Andrea Waxenegger, provides an answer to the question What can be understood by University Lifelong Learning today'. Taken as a whole, Universities and Engagement provides a theoretical background, drawing on recent research and practice examples, and demonstrates a variety of conceptual approaches, confirming the diverse range of possible solutions. The 17 papers collate the work of specialists from research and practice from across Europe and bevond who have firsthand experience in the field. The majority of the

contributing authors have been working closely with eucen for many years.

The idea for the book came up when preparing the eucen conference "Universities' Engagement in and with Society. The ULLL contribution". During this conference, eucen, in collaboration with the University of Graz, examined the diversity of ULLL (the "lifewide" dimension) and its potential for providing learning opportunities throughout one's life (the "lifelong" dimension). Consequently, the book covers the following areas of ULLL: Policy, practice and research; engaging with business and industry; engaging with communities and engaging with an ageing society. With this book, the editors and authors also take up the challenge that practitioners in ULLL are absorbed in their day-to-day 'business' and very sel-

dom find the time to reflect upon their knowledge and experience in form of publications, apart from quick presentations and short conference papers. This results in their valuable knowledge and experience not being visible and appreciated within their own institutions and not shared widely in the professional community. Specifically, the upcoming generations of professionals do not have sufficient access to this stock of knowledge. There are recent publications available which are devoted to particular aspects of ULLL, but Universities and Engagement offers an overall and integrated perspective on ULLL.
