This also means addressing inadequate primary and secondary education and opportunities for adult learning.

Three Congresses will be held between 2013 and 2017, progressively building and enacting a new agenda for change.


Objectives

The objectives of the World Congress series are to:

- Link existing access networks with new economic and social partners around the globe for greater impact.
- Build the economic, political and social case for improving education pathways and outcomes and use it to engage governments, policymakers, educational institutions, employers, social innovators, students, educators, practitioners, researchers and others in a collective agenda for change.
- Demonstrate innovative approaches, build communities of practice and create new social partnerships.
- Place current and future students and youth at the core of efforts to improve access to and success in postsecondary education.
- Develop an agenda for action and a series of experimental projects that will be the fulcrum for work by the movement.

When will the first Congress be held?

The first of three planned World Congresses will be held in Montreal, Canada, in 2013.





The Congress program will be inclusive, open and innovative. It is being designed to:

- Enable learning from international networks of experts in key areas affecting educational opportunities
- Raise awareness of the obstacles to successful participation in postsecondary education and of effective action to tackle them in different global settings
- Maximise the exchange of ideas and views among participants
- Spark creative and innovative solutions and new approaches to problems.

Pre- and post-Congress programs will focus on participation challenges and solutions in Canada.
