

Boyle's work focuses on public policy for large cities and their metropolitan areas. His research includes cross-national policy responses to urban decline, "shrinkage" in mid-west cities, and adptation of the built environment to assist "aging in place".

Michigan Suburbs, elected member of the US Urban
Affairs Association and Midwest representative for the US
Association of Collegiate School of Planning.

Boyle has served on two Detroit presidential initiatives: a Midtown Task Force and a review of the Urban Research and Outreach mission.
