Some extraordinary media reports have linked all kinds of social ills with the current activities of the European Union and its leaders. Much of the reporting of the situation in Europe has focused on short-term issues and does not provide a reasoned overview of the importance of this moment in European history, in shaping the next phase of the evolution of the European Union. For many European leaders, this is a period through which Europe will move to embrace a new phase of partnership, albeit one which is quite different from that which has existed in the past.

This forum is intended to offer some insight into these complexities and to provide scenarios of future developments, exploring the question: How might the European Union evolve over the next ten years?
