In a context of high levels of youth disengagement and unemployment, we invite all those involved in research, policy and active intervention to share their thinking on research and experience on national policies and practices that support young people's multiple transitions. Recognition of the importance of lifelong learning as a disposition in young people is crucial to support the transitions of young people, including those still in schools, into education and the labour market.

This Forum will provide opportunities to debate the effectiveness of national policies, institutional practices and the merits of alternative pathways from formal schooling to employment. These insights will inform action strategies for nations to evaluate and develop policy directions and to address the relevant targets of Goal 4 (Education and lifelong learning), of the Sustainable Development Goals.

All those with an interest in young people and engagement in learning and work are invited to attend. You will hear international researchers speak as well as local practitioners from schools, policy-making and community organisations. You will be able to share your experience and participate in workshops on options for action.
