The <u>Jean Monnet Sustainable Development Goals Network</u> continues its 2020 program with an exploration of **Sustainable Development Goal 12: Responsible Consumption and Production**. SDG 12 aims to 'ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns'. What does this mean, and how will this be achieved? What projects are already underway to deliver on this goal?

Building on the 2018-2019 program, which covered the first ten Goals, in 2020 the Network will host seminars on each of the remaining Goals. Each seminar will be accompanied by a <u>Policy Brief</u>, further exploring the ideas and issues raised during the discussion.

Panellists include Professor Nava Subramaniam, Deputy Dean, Research and Innovation, School of Business, RMIT University, and Associate Professor Kimberley Humphery, School of Global, Urban and Social Studies, RMIT University.

Professor Subramaniam's research interests encompass corporate social responsibility, auditing, enterprise risk management, and corporate governance. She is currently investigating SDG governance in Australian firms.

Associate Professor Humphery is best known for her work on the history, sociology and politics of consumption. Since 2004, she has been a Chief Investigator on four Australian Research Council grants and has held visiting research positions at the University of Manchester, King's College London and the University of Sussex.
