Thank you to everyone who provided feedback on the Annual Plan and Budget 2024/25, which we recently adopted.

Wyndham City remains the fastest growing municipality in Australia and as we come to the end of this Council term, this Budget aims to deliver a balanced capital works program. One that finishes what we started and continues to build the infrastructure our population needs.

Budget highlights for the Iramoo Ward include \$10.4 million for the Manor Lakes North Reserve Master Plan implementation.

Located at Holyoake Parade in Manor Lakes, this project includes sports fields for cricket, AFL football, tennis and other multi-use sports. It will be activated by Council in partnership with established as well as new clubs and organisations.

Other projects to receive funding include \$1.5 million for the redevelopment of four tennis courts at Galvin Park Reserve in Werribee and \$1.8 million to improve open space elements at Presidents Park. to further support the delivery of community events

Our Citizenship Awards open this month. Wyndham City's Citizen and Young Citizen of the Year Awards program recognises the outstanding contributions of Wyndham City residents who, through hard work and dedication, have significantly contributed to the community.

Four years ago, when this Council was elected, we made a commitment to provide all our residents with the services and infrastructure they deserve.

I'm proud to say we have delivered 250 capital works projects over this time, including **\$100 million** in road upgrades, 15 new and upgraded sports facilities, seven community centres and 400 kilometres of new footpaths.

That work is set to continue after Council recently endorsed our Annual Plan and Budget for 2024-25.

The **\$159.1 million** allocated to Capital Works aims to continue our massive infrastructure program, to keep connecting Wyndham residents, either by road, or through community, sporting and leisure facilities and open spaces.

Reducing traffic congestion and improving road safety remains a key focus for Council, and in this Draft Budget we're proposing to spend **\$11.6 million** to improve, upgrade and repair local roads."

Wyndham City remains the fastest growing municipality in Australia – and while that brings many benefits, it also increases cost pressures.

Since the beginning of our term, the municipality has grown by 50,000 people to a population of just over 320,000 – an increase of more than 15 per cent in just four years.

Council believes this budget strikes the balance between being fiscally responsible while still delivering the infrastructure and services our community needs.

Thank you to everyone who came along to Wyndham for You! at the beginning of this month, it was wonderful to see the community taking an opportunity to speak with officers to learn about the services and programs we provide.

2024-25 Draft Annual Plan and Rudget

A \$159.1 million Capital Works program highlights Wyndham Council's 2024-25 Annual Plan and Budget, which was endorsed by Council at its June meeting.

A total of **\$52.6 million** has been included to fund important road works across the municipality.

The funding will go toward both large and small projects, all designed to make Wyndham's roads safer, less congested and more userfriendly.

One of the key priorities is to build the Ison Road extension, which will connect residents in the west of Wyndham to the Princes Highway.

Other key road projects include **\$10.8 million** for duplication works at the intersection of Leakes Road and Tarneit Road.

Council will also spend **\$2.6 million** on design work for the Hobbs Road extension between Ballan Road and Sayers Road.

The Capital Works program is designed to continue Council's massive infrastructure program, to keep connecting Wyndham residents, either by road, or through community, sporting and leisure facilities and open spaces.

The endorsed Budget considered feedback from residents during a lengthy consultation process, which resulted in 108 contributions.

Highlights of the Budget include:

- **\$12.2 million** for Stage 1 construction works at the Tarneit North Community Precinct in Polly Parade, Tarneit
- **\$10.4 million** for towards the implementation of the Manor Lakes North Masterplan, located at Holyoake Parade, Manor Lakes

- **\$9.2 million** for Stage 1 works at Fortitude Drive Reserve in Truganina
- \$28.5 million to maintain our parks, open spaces and streetscapes
- **\$11.7 million** on library services
- **\$1.4 million** on new library resources
- **\$16.7 million** on Maternal Child and Heath Immunisation services
- **\$2.4 million** on the Wyn-R Project: Reduction, Renewables, Resilience
- **\$2 million** for Greening the Pipeline
- **\$6.5 million** for the Cultural Centre Upgrade
- \$7.5 million for Stage 1 and Stage 2 of the Jamieson Way Community Centre redevelopment in Point Cook

The Budget also included funding for community grants totalling **\$1.4 million**, putting more money in the hands of community groups and organisations to run programs and events that make a difference locally.

The State Government has set a rate cap of 2.75 per cent for the 2024-25 financial year.

Exciting Developments at Polly Parade Reserve

Wyndham City is excited to announce the commencement of construction at Polly Parade Reserve in Tarneit. This \$18 million project will unfold over two overlapping stages, transforming the area into a vibrant active open space.

Stage One will feature three natural turf soccer fields with an overlaid cricket oval, cricket practice nets, six tennis courts, sports lighting, paths, landscaping, drainage, irrigation, and fencing. Expected to be completed by mid-2025, this will allow the community to access and enjoy the new space while construction begins on stage two.

Stage Two, set to commence by mid-2025, will include the construction of a sports pavilion equipped with a social room, change rooms, storerooms, and a kiosk, providing essential amenities for the community.

This development is part of the broader \$26.7 million Tarneit North Community Precinct Masterplan. The masterplan also includes the Bembit Bag-rook Community Centre, which opened in October 2022 and offers a variety of community, health, and education services, including kindergarten and maternal and child health programs.

Stay tuned for more updates as we bring this exciting project to life, enhancing our community's recreational and social spaces.





Footpath Renewal Program Complete

Wyndham City is proud to announce the successful completion of the 2023/24 Footpath Renewal program, which saw an investment of \$2 million to upgrade 22 footpaths throughout the community.

The Program focused on removing and replacing deteriorated sections of footpaths in Hoppers Crossing, Point Cook, Truganina, Werribee, Wyndham Vale and Williams Landing. These upgrades aim to significantly enhance accessibility and usability for all community members.

Looking ahead, we've allocated an additional \$2 million for the Footpath Renewal Program in the 2024/25 budget, ensuring continued improvements and maintenance of essential pedestrian infrastructure.



Lollypop Creek Community Centre Now Operational

Wyndham City is delighted to announce that the Lollypop Creek Community Centre is now open at 104 Shipwright Parade in Werribee.

This \$12.9 million centre is designed to be flexible, sustainable, and innovative, catering to the diverse needs of the community by providing a safe and welcoming space for residents to connect and access local programs closer to home.

The centre features three kindergarten rooms with play spaces and essential amenities, as well as three maternal and child health consulting suites.


Additionally, the facility includes two multipurpose community rooms, two

meeting rooms, a community kitchen, and ample storage and office spaces.

Kindergarten services are set to commence in the first term of 2025, marking a significant milestone in enhancing the accessibility of early childhood education within the community.

Road Surface Renewal Program Complete

Wyndham City is pleased to announce the successful completion of the Road Surface Renewal Program, with an investment of \$3.25 million enhancing 20 roads across the community.

The program targeted roads in Hoppers Crossing, Laverton North, Little River, Point Cook, Tarneit, Truganina, Werribee, and Wyndham Vale, focusing on replacing deteriorated sections to improve surface quality, extend the lifespan of the roads, and enhance usability for residents.

In a continued commitment to maintaining and improving road infrastructure, Council has allocated a further \$3.05 million for the 2024/25 Road Surface Renewal Program.

Council elections across Victoria, including Wyndham, will be held on 26 October 2024.

This year's council elections are an opportunity for Wyndham residents to elect the candidates who they think best represent their vision and interests for a better, stronger and more sustainable future.

Council elections are held every four years.

Currently, Wyndham is represented by 11 Councillors in three Wards – Chaffey (four Councillors), Harrison (four Councillors) and Iramoo (three Councillors).

An Electoral Representation Advisory Panel completed an electoral structure review of Wyndham City Council in January.

Following the review, a number of changes will be made. At this year's election, 11 Councillors representing 11 single-member wards will be elected.

The new Ward names will be: Bemin Ward, Brinbeal Ward, Cheetham Ward, Featherbrook Ward, Grange Ward, Heathdale Ward, Iramoo Ward, Quandong Ward, Werribee Park Ward, Williams Landing Ward and Wimba Ward. All voting in the council election will be done via postal vote. The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) will send residents a voting ballot pack closer to the election.

Council-enrolled voters include ratepayers who are property owners, occupiers or corporations.




Wyndham Learning Festival 2024

The owners are thrilled with the improved presentation of their shop fronts, expressing that such enhancements would have been beyond their reach without this initiative. The project has not only refreshed the appearance of their shops but also reinvigorated their spirits, helping to build a more welcoming and appealing shopping precinct to attract and retain customers.

Creating vibrant spaces where people want to shop and dine is great for customers and for businesses.

This initiative has supported eight local businesses by upgrading their signage and improving their street presence which will encourage customers to stop, visit and boost the village shopping strip.

The installation of new temporary wayfinding signage at Hoppers Crossing Train Station including footpath decals near the train station and Bus Exchange will compliment and promote the Hoppers Junction businesses to commuters.

The area has been through many changes following the recent train crossing removal project and this initiative is helps residents and newcomers alike rediscover the charm and convenience of Hoppers Junction.
