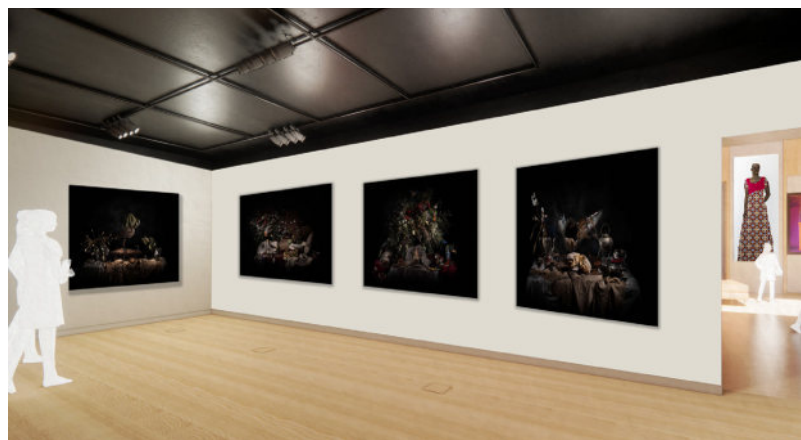

Cultural Centre Upgrade

Construction has begun on the \$7.4 million upgrade to one of Wyndham City's most prominent assets, the Wyndham Cultural Centre.

The upgrade to the Cultural Centre will deliver a transformed space that better meets the needs and expectations of exhibiting artists, audiences, users of the facility and the broader community.

The upgrade includes an internal upgrade of the foyer, relocation of the gallery to the downstairs area, refurbishment of gallery spaces, creation of a new collection space for visual art, relocation of staff administration spaces, and refurbishment of the bar and toilet amenities.

Additionally, there will be a direct entry into the library from Wedge Street.

The revamped Centre is expected to re-open in mid-2025.

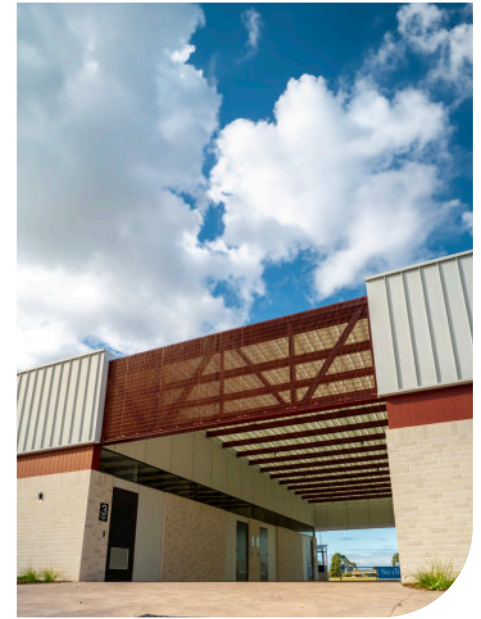
The library will remain open while works are underway, however there will be planned closures during critical stages of the project.

Exciting Developments at K Road Cliffs

We're thrilled to announce the commencement of stage one of the K Road Cliffs and Road Reconstruction project. This \$8.2 million phase focuses on drainage and beautification works at the K Road Cliffs, one of Werribee South's most unique natural assets. Our goal is to enhance this site, improve the visitor experience, and reduce significant erosion through the K Road Cliffs Master Plan.

Stage one of the works will include:

- **Major Drainage Works:** To reduce erosion of the K Road Cliffs edge.
- **New Cliff-Top Walking Path:** Running the length of the K Road Cliffs, featuring two viewing platforms with stunning overview of the Werribee River.
- **Staircase to Riverbank:** To provide convenient access and leisure spots.
- **New Picnic Shelter and Seating:** To offer comfortable spaces for visitors to relax and enjoy the natural surroundings.
- **Interpretive Signage:** To educate visitors about the area's natural and cultural significance.
- **Safety Fencing:** To ensure the safety of all visitors.

- **Car Parking:** To accommodate the increased number of visitors and improve accessibility.

The K Road Cliffs are a treasured part of our community, and these improvements will activate the site, making it more enjoyable for residents and visitors alike. Once stage one is complete, we will embark on stage two of the project, which involves the \$24 million reconstruction of K Road.

We look forward to the positive impact these enhancements will have on our community and the increased enjoyment they will bring to the K Road Cliffs. Stay tuned for more updates as we progress through this exciting project!

New Additions at Webster Street Reserve

We are thrilled to announce the completion of sporting pavilions at Webster Street Reserve. These new facilities, already in use by our local sporting clubs, are tailored to meet the needs of our community athletes and sporting enthusiasts.

The completion of these pavilions marks the final phase of the \$15.9 million development project at Webster Street Reserve. Each pavilion is equipped with amenities including change rooms, social spaces, storage areas, kitchens, umpire rooms, and a car park complemented by landscaping.

This development follows the recent opening of five new sporting fields, seven tennis courts, a multi-use court, cricket nets, and additional landscaping at the reserve. This space ensures that Webster Street Reserve remains a destination for local sports and recreation.

These enhancements are a testament to our commitment to providing top-notch facilities for our community. We look forward to seeing everyone enjoy the amenities at Webster Street Reserve.



Bringing New Life to Local Parks

Over the 2023/24 financial year, we have invested \$2.4 million upgrading the facilities in our parks and play spaces to make them vibrant areas that better meet the needs of our community.

Improvements were tailored to each play space based on the condition of the equipment and the specific requirements of the local community. Here's a snapshot of some of the works we've completed:

- **Parkwood Terrace Park, Point Cook, and Caradon Drive Park, Truganina:** Both parks and playgrounds have been upgraded, offering modern, safe, and enjoyable spaces for families and children.
- **Birdsong Glade and Wildwood Place, Tarneit:** A new footbridge has been constructed, enhancing accessibility and connectivity for residents in the area.
- **Folkstone Reserve Central Park, Werribee:** New drinking fountains have been installed, providing convenience for park-goers.
- **Hoppers Crossing Drainage Reserve:** Solar lights have been replaced and additional lights installed along the stretch between Bellbridge Drive and Mossfiel Drive,

improving safety and usability of the reserve during evening hours.

- **Brougham Avenue Park, Wyndhamvale:** Playground upgrade.
- **Southampton Drive Park, Point Cook:** Playground upgrade, landscape works, and new furniture installed.
- **Thames Boulevard Park, Tarneit:** Playground and basketball court upgrade, landscape works, and new furniture installed.
- **Sunset Views Boulevard and Edgevale Way, Tarneit:** These need to be added to the footbridge upgrades in Tarneit.

These enhancements are part of our ongoing commitment to improving local infrastructure and ensuring that our parks and recreational areas serve the community effectively. We look forward to seeing residents enjoy these upgraded spaces and appreciate the positive impact they have on our neighbourhoods.

Building better connections in Wyndham

We're pleased to announce the completion of Rushford Lane and the R1 Road reconstruction project. This initiative has had a positive impact on local businesses, particularly those situated along Rushford Lane, by enhancing daily operations, as well as mitigating any flooding issues that they were previously faced with.

Wyndham is committed to upgrading and maintaining local infrastructure

to create safer and more connected communities. This is further exemplified in our 2024/2025 budget, where a substantial \$52.6 million has been committed to reconstruct roads across our community.

Return your trolley and report abandoned trolleys!

Wyndham City is reminding shoppers that trolleys belong at retail complexes, not abandoned on streets or lost in parks and waterways.

Of those trolleys abandoned and reported to Council, most are left within one kilometre of four major shopping complexes.

Shoppers are reminded that if they need to walk their shopping home, an alternative like buying a foldable trolley should be considered as abandoning a trolley is an act of littering and residents can be fined up to \$395.

Residents are urged to help keep our streets free of dumped trolleys. Trolleys should be returned to retailers and if spotted in streets reported through the Trolley Tracker app or to those retailers listed on Council's website at:

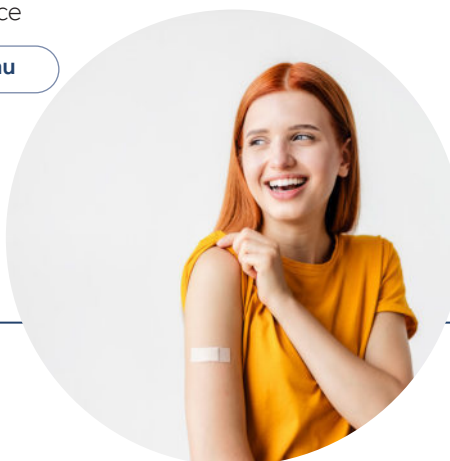

Call for increased vaccinations

Wyndham City is urging parents and school children to take immediate steps to address a drop in vaccination rates among Year 7 and Year 10 students.

Vaccines are available for preventable diseases such as Human Papilloma Virus (HPV), Meningococcal, Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Whooping Cough.

Year 7 Students are offered the HPV vaccine and a booster dose against Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Whooping Cough (Boostrix). The HPV vaccine

protects against nine strains of HPV that cause over 90 per cent of cervical cancers and over 95 per cent of HPV-related cancers in both men and women.

Year 10 Students are offered the Meningococcal ACWY vaccine, which helps protect against a potentially life-threatening disease that can spread quickly among adolescents.

How Parents Can Help:

- **Check Vaccination Status:** Parents can review their child's vaccination history through their MyGov account or the Medicare mobile app

- **Provide Online Consent:** Consent for vaccinations should be registered online via the Central Immunisation Records Victoria (CIRV) portal
- **Attend Community Immunisation Sessions:** Adolescents can receive these vaccines for free at community immunisation sessions. Appointments can be made through Wyndham Immunisation Services

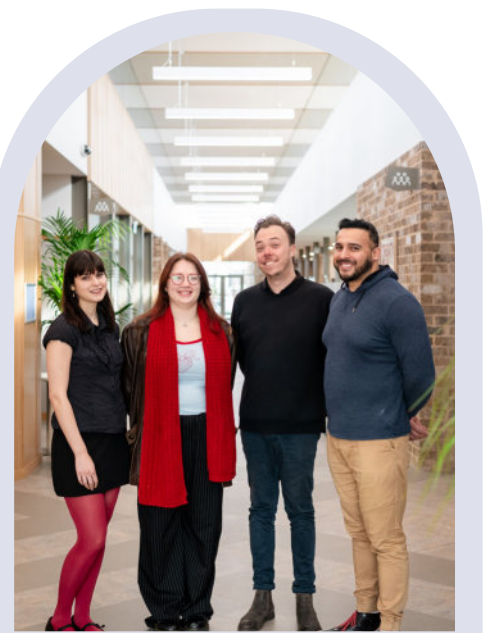

What can go in a green-lid bin

- Citrus, onions, garlic & spicy foods
- Seafood
- Dairy products & egg shells
- Bread, pasta, rice & cereals
- Meat & bones
- Branches, twigs & leaves
- Lawn clippings & weeds
- Fruit & vegetable scraps
- Coffee grounds & loose leaf tea

What can't go in a green-lid bin

- Garbage
- Plastic bags
- Coffee pods
- Dog/Cat poo
- Cigarette butts
- Ceramic crockery
- Tea bags
- Soil and rocks

More can be recycled in Green-lid bins!

Our green-lid bin service now allows you to recycle more types of food waste, not just fruit and vegetable scraps.

If you have food scraps from left overs or are cleaning out your fridge you can now recycle all your food waste (without packaging) into your green-lid bin.

You can also still add your grass, branches, leaves and weeds.

By recycling food and green waste, you're diverting waste from going to landfill which is beneficial for the environment as it reduces the creation of harmful greenhouse gases.

The food and green waste is recycled into compost and mulch that is then used on farms or parks and gardens.

What is the highlight of your role?

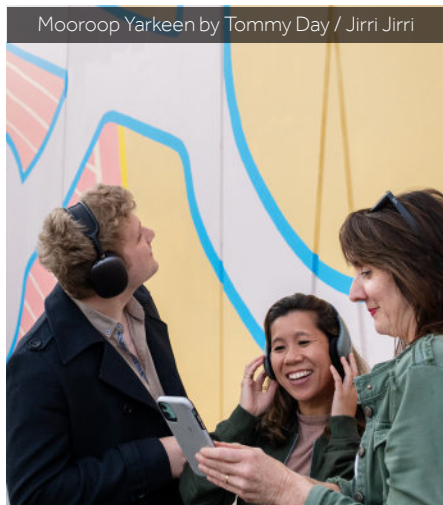

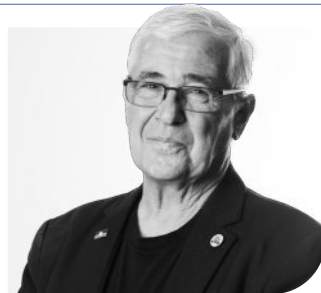
