## The SDGs as a Framework for COVID-19 recovery in Cities and Regions

The pandemic has set back parts of the progress made on the 2030 Agenda but also illustrated how local and regional governments have been on the frontline, taking powerful political decisions in exceptional circumstances to enhance the well-being of residents in cities, regions and rural areas. The SDGs offer a clear and stable framework to guide local and regional governments in shaping a transformative recovery from COVID-19.

- This session will launch three new OECD reports on *A Territorial Approach to the SDGs* in Kitakyushu (Japan), Córdoba (Argentina) and Paraná (Brazil) and highlight how these cities and regions plan to use the OECD tailored recommendations to recover from the pandemic in the medium and long term.

## City-to-city partnerships to achieve the SDGs

---

City-to-city partnerships are gaining traction as a mechanism to achieve the SDGs with, in particular, the dedicated goals on “Partnerships and enablers for SDGs” (SDG 17) and on “Sustainable cities and communities” (SDG 11). The G20 Development Working Group, supported by the OECD secretariat, is developing High-level

Principles for city-to-city partnerships and a compendium of good policy practices with inspiring examples to promote the localisation of the SDGs through partnerships between cities, notably intermediary cities.

### **The role of universities to support cities and regions to achieve the SDGs**

---

Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) hold a direct role in the achievement of the SDGs. In fact, as they often bear the responsibility of promoting sustainability and inclusion, in many cases HEIs have been early adopters of the SDGs, which have inspired their strategic documents and initiatives. Universities are increasingly playing a key role for the preparation of Voluntary Local Reviews of targeted cities across the globe through providing data, evidence and analytical support to city governments. The session will also explore the role of HEIs to support cities and regions to achieve the SDGs through a territorial approach.
