

Wyndham Council last month adopted its 2023-24 Annual Plan and Budget, which includes more than \$38 million to build new roads, resurface and renew old ones and improve our Active Transport Network.

The Budget will also deliver **\$432 million** in vital services and programs that benefit residents, including **\$20 million** for Kindergartens and Children's services, **\$11.9 million** for Maternal Child and Health Immunisations and **\$10.8 million** for Libraries.

A further **\$41 million** is included in the endorsed Budget to maintain reserves and open spaces, playgrounds and key services related to the beautification of Wyndham such as mowing, watering and tree planting.

The Budget includes a **\$167 million** Capital Works program, with highlights including:

- Road construction, upgrades and renewals \$33.2 million
- Active Transport Network \$5 million
- Tarneit North Master Plan Implementation \$11 million
- Truganina Community Centre \$10.1 million
- Alfred Road Reserve Implementation \$8.3 million
- Webster Street Reserve \$4.75 million
- Jamieson Way Master Plan Stage One \$3 million
- Black Forest Road South Community Centre \$5 million
- Manor Lakes North Reserve Master Plan Implementation
 \$3.6 million

Key road projects include the duplication of Tarneit Road between Sayers Road and Leakes Road **(\$4.5 million)**, the reconstruction of K Road Werribee South **(\$3.5 million)**, intersection works for Davis and Dohertys Road **(\$2.5 million)** and **\$4.9 million** for various local road reconstruction projects.

The State Government has set a rate cap of 3.5 per cent for the 2023-24 financial year.

The Budget also includes **\$1.45 million** in grants funding, putting more money in the hands of community groups and organisations to run programs and events that make a difference locally.

The Budget was finalised after Council received extensive feedback from residents in person at Pop Up sessions and online via The Loop website.

CHECK OUT TRUGANINA'S

NEWEST ACTIVE OPEN SPACE!

The final piece of Alcock Road Reserve is now complete, with the turf established at the reserve's three soccer fields (which can also be used to create a cricket field).

The space also includes six tennis courts, a sporting pavilion, new cricket nets, playgrounds, BBQ and picnic areas, landscaping and a car park.

The \$15.1 million project, which was jointly funded through Wyndham City (\$12.1 million) and the Victorian Government (\$3 million), gives Truganina residents the sport and recreation

facilities they need at their doorstep.

The reserve is part of the Truganina South-East Community Precinct Master Plan and is located next to the recently opened Koomail Tardy Community Centre, which provides kindergarten, maternal child health and community programs and services.

BOUNDARY AND DAVIS ROAD INTERSECTION

UPGRADE COMPLETE

The \$1 million project, which was jointly funded by Wyndham City Council and Melton City Council, included pavement widening and resurfacing to provide a safer and smoother journey.

Works also included improvements to signage and line marking and road drainage upgrades.

These works provide enhanced intersection safety and an overall smoother drive in line with Wyndham City's Road Safety Strategy 2022-2032, which envisions that everyone who travels on our roads and paths will arrive safely at their destination.

Troups Road South will remain closed while Melton City completes the remainder of the Troups Road South upgrade.



WHAT A SITE TO SEE!

We're making great progress on the new \$18.4 million Truganina Community Centre, with the slab setting and steel frames rising!

Mayor Susan McIntyre, Deputy Mayor Jennie Barrera and Member for Laverton, Sarah Connolly MP gathered on site recently to see progress on the new centre, which will offer a range of recreational, educational and cultural activities for all age groups.

Located at 1 Everton Road, this centre will provide a range of community, health and education services and programs in our high-growth areas, including kindergarten and maternal child health.

A library lounge is also included in the design, which will include a small collection of items residents can borrow and access to technology and quiet spaces.

Work is slated for completion in 2024, with a staged delivery of services. Three and four-year-old kindergarten will commence in 2025.

This project has received significant Victorian Government funding, including \$4 million from the Growing Suburbs Fund, a \$3 million Building Blocks Grant and \$921,000 from the Living Libraries Infrastructure Program.

CHECK OUT HOPPERS CROSSING LIBRARY'S TEMPORARY SPACE!

The Hoppers Crossing Library is currently closed due to essential building works at Pacific Werribee and will be relocating to a temporary location this month.

From 10 July, you can find us at the former Squires Loft restaurant on level 1 at Pacific Werribee, near Village Cinemas and Myer.

The temporary space will continue to provide all the usual services and will include a small collection of books and other library items, study tables, public computers and a reading nook.

We will also continue to run a small calendar of programs out of the temporary space.

Wyndham City will take the opportunity during these works to increase the size of the public space at Hoppers Crossing Library by adding two new meeting rooms, with works funded through a Victorian Government Living Libraries Grant.

TIMES SOUARE PARK IN SANCTUARY LAKES IS

GETTING AN UPGRADE!

Construction is well underway on the \$544,000 Wyndham City project, which will include a new playground and swing set, nature play, a table tennis table, sheltered seating area, additional bench seating and new bike loops.

There will also be an accessible ramped path connecting the play space to the existing pram crossing and path network, expanded car park, a new rubberised surface added to the existing exercise equipment and pet-friendly features, including a drink fountain with dog bowl and bin with dog-bag dispenser.

The existing large open lawn space will remain, with community feedback showing that the space is popular for kick-to-kick and other games.

These works will deliver better play equipment – for pre-school kids especially – and will make Times Square Park more accessible and pram-friendly for young families.

Work is expected to be complete in mid-2023.

YOUTH RESOURCE CENTRE REFRESH

UNDERWAY

Wyndham City's Youth Resource Centre is getting a makeover!

Construction is underway to refresh the space, including upgrades to the quiet room, multipurpose room, consulting room, foyer, flooring and lighting.

Work will also include a refit of the kitchens and new furniture inspired by Indigenous artwork.

The project is being jointly funded by Wyndham City Council (\$143,000) and the Victorian Government (\$150,000).

The centre will remain closed until the end of July while the works take place, with all programs and activities relocated to other sites in the interim.

Graeme Prentice

Describe your volunteer role?

My current role is as a Firefighter and Secretary for the Point Cook Fire Brigade (CFA). I am finding that after 51 years, I have slowed down a little on chasing fires but the Secretary role keeps me very busy. I also support the Brigade Training Officer with the training of our recruits. As a brigade we interact with the community to promote fire prevention through visits to kindergartens, sporting and community events.

What is the highlight of your role?

Although there are many highlights from fires and incidents attended, the most memorable highlight was the gratitude given to firefighters, by the children, when we were in Mallacoota during the 2019/2020 fires that devastated the town. Of great importance to all firefighters is knowing that the fire prevention messages have removed the risk of fires and injuries or at least reduced those risks when fires and incidents occur. It is particularly encouraging to see how readily children understand the information provided.

What would you say to people considering volunteering?

Before committing to becoming a volunteer, check the many volunteer roles that are available to ensure that you find something that takes your interest and is consistent with your own values. Don't worry if you are short of skills, as the volunteer organisations will provide training, if you are willing to make a commitment.

What is your favourite place in Wyndham?

Wyndham is such a diverse community, which caters for everyone's needs, without having to travel outside its boundaries. My recommendation would be that everyone must take time to visit the Werribee Zoo. I don't believe that there is anywhere in the world that provides an open range experience to compare with this.

Climate Futures & Environment

This portfolio focuses on establishing policies to create more liveable, better designed and well-connected neighbourhoods through mixed land use, different housing types and greater access to quality public transport. It also focuses on ways to manage growth and ensure that development is sustainable.

We are now moving into the second half of 2023 and it's going to be a busy six months as we roll out projects that support and innovate the design of Wyndham City.

I am excited to share that Council has recently established a new Heritage Unit within the Strategic Planning and Property Department to better ensure that Wyndham's rich heritage is being appropriately recognised and protected – from the living Aboriginal Cultural Heritage of the region to the historic places that tell the story of our history and make Wyndham unique.

Wyndham has already completed Stage 1 of the Heritage Review to identify places of heritage significance, and a number of projects are currently underway including Stage 2 of the Heritage Review which is focused on identifying, recognising and protecting residential places and precincts of significance, in consultation with the community.

A \$1 million upgrade of the Boundary and Davis Road intersection in Mount Cottrell is now complete. The project, which was jointly funded by Wyndham City Council and Melton City Council, included pavement widening and resurfacing to provide a safer and smoother journey.

With an increase of housing estates in the surrounding area, these works provide enhanced intersection safety and an overall smoother drive in line with Wyndham City's Road Safety Strategy 2022-2032, which envisions that everyone who travels on our roads and paths will arrive safely at their destination.

The Climate Future and Environment portfolio works with the community and other stakeholders to respect, preserve and protect our local environment through renewable energy, recycling, habitat and conservation, waste and water practices.

In Wyndham, we are working towards an efficient, clean energy focused and resilient future, and I'm excited to update you on our progress.

Lighting the West continues to bring sustainable street lighting to Wyndham. The changeover of over 19,000 streetlights with energy-efficient globes will save over 6,000 tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions per year and Council \$38 million in electricity fees over the 20-year lifespan of the new globes. Officers are currently working on Stage Three of this project, which involves the replacement of 6,400 decorative-style streetlights.

Wyn-R continues to provide direct support for a clean energy transition and a direct pathway to a low-carbon future by delivering over 1.5MW of additional solar resources to new and existing council assets. You can find out more about locations here: wyndham.vic.gov.au/solar-wynr-project

In April, young people attended a summit hosted by the Climate Futures Youth Leaders Volunteers, a local group of empowered youth aged 14- 26 who advocate for environmental protection and climate change action.

A terrific example of grassroots innovation, the summit invited participants to learn practical ways of engaging with climate change, featuring a climate action panel and workshops on biodiversity, gardening, waste and recycling.

Discover WERRIBEE ZOO

Dr Mark Pilgrim is the Director of Werribee Open Range Zoo. He talks to Wyndham News about the key tourism destination and big plans for its development.

Before joining Werribee Open Range zoo, where did you work?

My zoo career began in 1988 as a bird keeper at Chester Zoo in the UK. At that time, I knew I wanted to work with animals and in the conservation space, however it was only my intention to work in the zoo industry for about a year as I thought it would be an enjoyable experience. It didn't quite work out like that, because my passion for wildlife and conservation continued to grow. I worked in a number of roles in the next 33 years, including as a zookeeper, curator, director and then ten years as the CEO. Chester Zoo is the most visited zoo in the UK and achieved two million visitors in 2019. I left to become a consultant on a number of zoo projects around the world including the US and Kenya before taking up the role of Director of Werribee Open Range Zoo in March 2022.

Why should people visit the Zoo?

There are many great reasons why people should visit Werribee Open Range Zoo. Firstly, the staff welcome each and every visitor as a special guest and it's a great day out with something for everyone. The Zoo is a wonderful place and enables guests to experience the essence of Africa. Visitors can encounter many native African species along the African River Trail including African wild dogs, lions, monkeys and gorillas. The Australian Trail allows you to get up close to some of our incredible Australian animals including kangaroos, emus and koalas. The river walk along the Werribee River on Bunurong and Wadawurrung country is a wonderful place to find peace and connect with nature.

other incredible species, is a unique experience matched only by an African safari.

As well as a great day out, visiting any of the Zoos Victoria's zoos, including Melbourne Zoo, Werribee Open Range Zoo, Healesville Sanctuary and Kyabram Fauna Park, enables us to continue our world-renowned conservation work to save 27 local native priority fighting extinction species. These are the species in Victoria that are of greatest threat of extinction and, through our scientific approach to research, zoo breeding, release and monitoring, we remain true to our pledge that "no Victorian vertebrate species will go extinct on our watch".

Tell us about the future plans for the zoo...

The big plans for the future are that the wonderful herd of Asian elephants at Melbourne Zoo, including seven adults and their three calves, will move to a specially designed elephant habitat at Werribee Open Range Zoo that covers 21 hectares in 2024. This is huge for Werribee and will be such an important and world class feature in the West of Melbourne.

What is your favourite exhibit?

My favourite habitat is the Savannah, the expansive open range mixed-species habitat for some of Africa's most iconic large herbivores. Giraffe, zebra, rhino, ostriches and a variety of antelope are just some of the species that can be viewed during the Zoo's savannah bus tour.
